Program Coordinator Jean Knight related that the City of Prescott attorney as well as the Jacobs Engineering attorney have reviewed and come to an consensus on the Professional Services Agreement. She indicated that once the Board approves the Agreement, it will go the City of Prescott Council for review and approval.

Phil Bourdon, Yavapai County Engineer, explained the MPO receives approximately \$633,000 in federal funding for allocated projects. He related that Mr. Bridges is progressive about programming the funding for the projects that are going to occur. Mr. Bourdon stated basically it is a use it or lose it and additional changes could occur in the future. The recommended changes are as follows:

- FY12 JCT 89A to Ruger Road (Design)
- FY14 SR 89/Perkinsville Road (Intersection Improvements)
- FY15 JCT 89A to Ruger Road
- FY16 Ruger Road to South Chino Valley
