5. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE THE MARCH 17, 2021 EXECUTIVE BOARD REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

MOTION

Vice-Chair Brown motioned to approve the March 17, 2021 Executive Board Regular Meeting Minutes. Member Knight seconded the motion.

VOTE

The vote on the motion was unanimous.

6. CYMPO ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Vincent Gallegos, CYMPO Administrator (Task #100)

- North Prescott Area Planning (NPAP)
- Yavapai County Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee (CPAC)
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
- SR89 to SR89A On-Ramps Alternative Selections Report (ASR)

Mr. Gallegos noted that he has been invited to attend meetings for the North Prescott Area Plan (NPAP) and Yavapai County Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee (CPAC). Noted that CYMPO has recently hired a consultant to evaluate crash data from the last five years and work with CYMPO to identify potential projects to submit applications for HSIP funding.

Mr. Gallegos explained that staff is working with the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) to develop a scope of work for the State Route 89 to State Route 89A On-Ramps Alternatives Selection Report (ASR) and aim to issue a Request for Quotes (RFQ) in May or June.

Mr. Gallegos noted the TAC has tabled any action for the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and that CYMPO plans to schedule a joint TAC and Executive Board retreat to further discuss projects to include in the Program.

Member Goode noted CYMPO's acknowledgement of the value in moving the SR89 to SR89A On-Ramps Alternative Selections Report (ASR) forward.

Member Brown called on Mr. Cherry, Yavapai County Public Works Director and CYMPO TAC member, to describe Yavapai County's experience with HSIP projects. Mr. Cherry explained that Yavapai County was awarded HSIP funding for improvements on Cornville Road and Route 66/Fort Rock Road. Noted support for CYMPO's pursuit of the funding for qualifying projects.

Mr. Gallegos clarified that together with CYMPO, the project consultant will prepare applications and then turn over applications to the respective jurisdiction for submission.

7. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO SELECT THE SECRETARY/TREASURER OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Mr. Gallegos clarified that the responsibilities of Secretary/Treasurer is currently performed by the fiscal agent of the MPO, Yavapai County. Explained that in the event CYMPO no longer has a fiscal agent, the Secretary/Treasurer would take on the role and responsibilities for the MPO.

Chairman Palguta motioned to elect Member Goode as the Secretary/Treasurer of the Executive Board. Vice-Chair Brown seconded the motion.

8. CALL TO THE PUBLIC FOR COMMENT ON THE DRAFT FY 2022-2023 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

This is an opportunity for members of the public to discuss items of interest regarding the Draft FY2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program.

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No public comments were provided.

Member Goode inquired if the FY2022-2023 Unified Planning Work Program would reflect new census data. Mr. Gallegos confirmed, yes, once data is received it will be incorporated into the document.

11. ADOT NORTHWEST DISTRICT REPORT

Alvin Stump, Northwest District Engineer
Member Stump was unavailable for an update at the time.

12. STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD UPDATE

Gary Knight, ADOT District 6 Representative

Mr. Knight noted that the Arizona State Transportation Board is in the public hearing phase of state five-year plan. Noted that a bid was awarded for ½-inch mill, 3-inch asphalt and concrete overlay, and guard rails improvements on Interstate-17 to Red Rock Vista on SR179.

13. RTAC UPDATE

Kevin Adam, RTAC

Mr. Adam explained that the funding forecast continues to improve contrary to what was originally expected at the beginning of the pandemic. A carryforward balance in excess of \$2 billion is expected. Noted that the focal point of legislative leaders as well as the governor appears to be tax cuts, primarily state income tax. Noted there is talk about phasing in a statewide flat income tax of 2.5% and appears to be a reluctance of leadership to hold cities and counties harmless. Following priority of tax cuts, infrastructure appears to be next in line and leadership indicated \$200 million is being set aside to be distributed across the state. Mr. Adam explained it is possible for

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the \$200 million figure to increase. Noted large revenue potential and suggested agencies be prepared to pursue that funding.
