10:15 AM: CYMPO Planning Boundary – Vinny Gallegos

Mr. Gallegos provided a presentation about possible CYMPO boundary expansion scenarios. Members of the Executive Board and Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) discussed how rural communities would be prioritized if included in the CYMPO boundary. Jennifer O'Conner, with NACOG, noted the benefit of providing more comprehensive planning for the southwest communities that would potentially be included in the CYMPO boundary.

10:45 AM: ADOT Funding/Project Update – Vinny Gallegos

Jason James, ADOT Multimodal Planning Division Anthony Brozich, ADOT Northwest District

Mr. James provided a presentation regarding funding available to Greater Arizona in the categories of preservation, bridge, modernization, and expansion. Also reviewed the Arizona Department of Transportation's (ADOT's) Planning to Programming process.

Mr. Gallegos discussed funding available for improvements to the SR89 to SR89A On-Ramps. Mr. Brozich reviewed funding available through ADOT District Minor Funds. Members of the Executive Board and TAC discussed revising the project, or looking for alternative funding sources and partnership opportunities.

11:15 AM: Project Assessment/Grant Funding – Lindsay Post

Phyllis Davis, Kittelson & Associates

Ms. Davis reviewed the Project Assessment project. Explained that Kittelson & Associates will research grant opportunities and align them with competitive projects within the CYMPO region. Members of the Executive Board and TAC discussed strategies for creating competitive grant applications.
